

Orchard House Late collection and non- collection

At Orchard House we expect all parents to agree to collect their child from the nursery on time unless notified of a significant event. We give all parents information about our opening and closing time and the procedures we follow if they are expected to be late collecting their child. These include:

- Agreeing a password with the nursery in advance to be used by the designated person collecting the child on the parent's behalf. (giving child's name, their name, and the agreed password)
- Calling the nursery as soon as possible to notify us that they are going to be late.
- Having an emergency contact or person to collect their child on their behalf.
- Informing the nursery of the person's identity so we can put the child at ease, reducing any distress caused.
- If the designated person has not collected the child previously, the parent must provide a detailed description of the person. They must know the allocated password for us at Orchard House to release the child.

Late charges:

6-15 and 6-30pm £17.00 6-30 and 7.00pm £30.00

After 7pm Variable

Late charges MUST be paid in cash to the practitioners that have stayed with your child/ren. Please can you ensure that late charges are paid as early as possible. THANK YOU

If a child has not been collected from the nursery after a reasonable amount of time the deadline is 7.30pm, which allows parents 1 hour and 15 minutes from when the nursery closes and if the parents have not kept the practitioners updated and informed, we will follow the procedures for non-collection. These are:

• The practitioner will notify the nursery manager that the child has not been collected.

- The manager will try to contact the parent on the contact numbers provided. If this fails, the manager will try the emergency contacts listed.
- In the event of no contact being made after the agreed time the person in charge will call the local authority children's social services emergency duty team.
- The nursery will notify Ofsted as soon as possible.
- The two practitioners will remain with the child until suitable arrangements have been made.
- The child's needs will always be met to ensure that they do not become distressed or upset.
